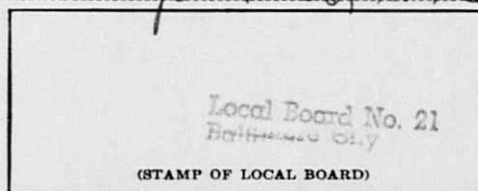

Charles M. Ungerbuehler, Jr. left his family and friends on Wednesday, March 27, 2019.

He was born on October 5, 1937 in Wilmington, Delaware to Evelyn Sturgis and Charles Marsden Ungerbuehler, Sr.

Chuck graduated from William Penn High School in 1955, studied naval architecture and applied his studies in assisting his father in their boat building business.

He entered the Coast Guard in 1958, was stationed in New York and completed his service on an ice breaker. He was honorably discharged.

Chuck joined the DuPont Company, Engineering Department, where he was an industrial model builder.

He retired after thirty years service as supervisor of the model shop. Immediately upon retirement, he joined Brice Builders where he (for years) was instrumental in the building of prestigious homes at the beach.

Following his retirement from Brice Builders, he joined the Lewes Historical Society where he was loved and respected in his work of restoration and maintenance.

Chuck was a carver of waterfowl and won First Place in Ward Brothers competition, in his class as well as First Place in New York state where his bird was also exhibited.

For years, he was a wedding photographer in Wilmington; and was also awarded for his nature photography by the Wilmington Camera Club and the DuPont Camera Club.

He is survived by his two sons, Trent Ungerbuehler and Shane Meeds Brice; two daughters, Carla and Patricia; and his wife of forty-four years, Maxine McWhorter Ungerbuehler who adored him.
