Elizabeth Skinner and Franklin Ungerbuehler

Elizabeth Ungerbuehler was born Elizabeth Rice Skinner, named after Mary Rice, her maternal grandmother. Elizabeth was the youngest daughter of Harry and Lizzie Skinner. In 1908, she married Franklin Ungerbuehler. Franklin was from Philadelphia. The wedding took place near his home at a Methodist Church located at 29th and York Streets, near Fairmont Park in northwest Philly.

Elizabeth, unlike her older sisters Lora and Ursula, was not married at the Skinner home in Glassboro. Not sure how Elizabeth met a Philadelphia guy, but it was likely that she and/or her sister Lora were commuting to Philadelphia to work from their home at Glassboro, NJ.

Elizabeth and Franklin settled in at Philadelphia. He was a foreman or manager at various different textile firms during the course of his life. In the 1920's, the family relocated to the Richardson Park section of Wilmington, Delaware, just a short distance from Elizabeth's sister – Lora (Skinner) Sheppard.

Franklin's WWII draft card (1942) shows that the Ungerbuehlers were now living south of Wilmington on (Old) State Road in New Castle. This would be the home I remember from my youth in the 1960's. The distinctive home sat by itself on a hill on the west side of Rt. 13, south of the intersection with the Pulaski Highway. We passed the house every now and then and my Dad would always point it out. Rt. 13 was the main corridor up and down the east coast of the US before the advent of I-95 in the 1970's, and we traveled it many times.

I never met Franklin Ungerbuehler. I met Elizabeth one time – in 1960, one day after the death of her husband Franklin. On that day, my grandfather (Earl Skinner) drove my Dad and I down to the home of Elizabeth's son, Marsden (Earl's cousin), in Delaware. Marsden then drove us next door to his parent's house on the hill. A few days later, my Dad attended Franklin's funeral.

Following the death of her husband, Elizabeth (Skinner) Ungerbuehler was moved to the care of her son Marsden, and later, to the care of her younger son Ben.







Charles 'Marsden' Ungerbuehler

Marsden, eldest son of Elizabeth and Franklin, was born in 1910. He served in WWII, enlisting at the tail end of the war. In the 1950's and early-60's, Marsden and wife Evelyn lived in a small home next door to Marsden's parents on Rt. 13 in New Castle, Delaware, south of Wilmington. The home was long and narrow with a sloping roof. The rooms sat side by side –you walked thru one to get to the next. My impression was that the home was a converted chicken coop, though that may have been a tall tale. The home is still there today as a part of a garden center.

We would visit Marsden and Evelyn every Christmas in the early 1960's. By 1966, Marsden and wife had moved to the other side of Rt. 13 in a development called Llangollen Estates. Our visits with them tapered off and I only recall one visit to their Llangollen home.

Marsden graduated from a NJ school of naval architecture and he founded a company that built wooden power boats. The last time I saw Marsden was circa 1973, when he showed us a teak boat he had built for himself. The boat was beautiful - he was an amazing master craftsman. I recall him telling us how he had shellacked the interior of his garage to prevent any dust from settling on the boat while he applied the many thin coats of finish to the wood. We took a ride in the boat - out a creek and into the Delaware River.

Marsden's son attended my sister's wedding in 1987, the last time I saw anyone from that line of the family. Cousin Dick Hughlett recently tried to establish contact with Marsden's son but did not get beyond a phone conversation.

Ben Ungerbuehler

Ben, younger brother to Marsden, was born in 1912. He lived at a development called Blue Rock Manor in North Wilmington. I recall a visit in the early 1970's when his elderly mother was under his care. On our next visit in 1975, his mother Elizabeth (Skinner) Ungerbuehler had recently died. On that visit, Ben showed us some of his mother's effects that were stored in his garage and headed for the trash. I was age 21 and already had the family history bug. I grabbed several photograph albums, a bible, and some other records. Judging by the photos in the albums, I would say that the albums had originally belonged to Ben's maternal grandparents – Harry and Lizzie Skinner. All of those items are reproduced here and there in this family history.

Ben Ungerbuehler had a close relationship with my grandparents, and to a lesser extent, my parents. The last time I saw him was at my grandparent's home at Sanibel, FL in Sep, 1983. He seemed in good shape and showed me how he did push-ups against the side of the kitchen table. My impression of Ben is that he was a very sharp, talented person. He died about ten years later. Ben had two children – Richard and Jane. My father often mentioned how much he appreciated the fact that Richard took the time to attend the funeral of Earl Skinner in 1990. Richard, an entrepreneur, and his wife are retired in St. Augustine, FL. Richard and I are in email contact.



Wilmington, Delaware and Vicinity [google.com]

Charles Sheppard grew up in Wilmington, Delaware. Charles and wife Lora (Skinner) lived at several addresses in Wilmington including Richardson Park [**Sheppard**].

Franklin Ungerbuehler grew up in Philadelphia. He and wife Elizabeth Skinner lived in Philadelphia for a time, and then moved to 303 S. Maryland Ave., Wilmington, a few blocks from the Sheppards, by 1930.

By the 1940's, the Ungerbuehlers were living on Rt. 13 in New Castle [**Franklin**]. Son **Marsden** lived next door. Around 1966, Marsden moved across Rt. 13 to Gordy Lane, Llangolen Estates [**Marsden2**]. Brother **Ben** lived in North Wilmington at a development called Blue Rock Manor in the 1960's.
